Nature of support 2012/13

- 1-1 tuition provided by qualified teacher for 2 FSM children, ten week course tailored to individuals.
- Additional TA support provided for individuals working on basic Literacy, Numeracy skills and phonics catch up.
- Six week course attended by FSM children, focusing on speaking and listening skills.

Curriculum focus of PPG spending 2012/13

- To increase the percentage of children eligible for FSM to progress 4 points over the year in Numeracy.
- To increase the percentage of children eligible for FSM to progress 4 points over the year in Literacy.
- To ensure FSM children achieve the phonics end of year pass mark.
- To develop children's self-esteem and speaking and listening skills.

Measuring the impact of PPG spending

The school will evaluate the impact on each pupil at the end of the each term. Evaluation will focus on academic gains and how pupils' self-confidence has developed as a consequence of the intervention. This evaluation shall be reported termly to Governors.
