### **Parking**

It has been brought to our attention that there has been some dangerous and inconsiderate parking on Brookes Avenue and particular on the corner near the bollards.

We have contacted the County Council about this and have been requested to urge those who can walk, cycle or scoot to do this in order to keep Leicestershire moving and to keep areas around school safe for other road users and pedestrians. Where walking, cycling and scooting is not possible we encourage parents to park with care away from the main school gates and from junctions.

We have been informed that it is an offence under the Road Traffic Act 1988 for any person in charge of a vehicle to cause or permit that vehicle to stand on a road/footway in such a manner that is considered to be dangerous, or that which causes an obstruction to the safe and effective use of the highway. Any such instances of this should be reported to the Police on their non-emergency number 101. 
