



Key Vocabulary	
<b>Good Friday</b>	The day that Jesus died on the <b>cross</b> .
<b>The Last Supper</b>	The final meal that Jesus ate with his <b>disciples</b> before he died.
<b>disciples</b>	Jesus' close friends and followers.
<b>Judas</b>	One of Jesus' <b>disciples</b> .
<b>sacrifice</b>	Jesus giving himself up to be crucified to save humankind.
<b>cross</b>	The large wooden <b>cross</b> that Jesus was crucified on.
<b>Pontius Pilate</b>	The Roman governor.
<b>betray</b>	Being disloyal to someone.

## Key Information

**Good Friday** is part of the Easter story. It was the day that Jesus was crucified on the **cross**. **Good Friday** is seen as a very important day in the Christian calendar because Christians believe that Jesus **sacrificed** himself for others.



Judas	The Last Supper	
<p>Many priests were jealous of Jesus and wanted to see him arrested. One of Jesus' <b>disciples</b> (<b>Judas</b> Iscariot) <b>betrayed</b> Jesus for 30 silver pieces.</p> <p>Jesus knew this at <b>the Last Supper</b>.</p> 	<p>Jesus ate his final supper with his <b>disciples</b>. He told them at the meal that he knew one of them had already planned to <b>betray</b> him.</p> <p>Jesus picked up some bread and told the <b>disciples</b>: "This is my body. Take it and eat it and remember me." He picked up the wine and said: "This is my blood. Drink it and remember me."</p> 	<p>Jewish leaders found Jesus guilty of calling himself the Son of God. Jesus was taken to <b>Pontius Pilate</b> for a punishment. The chief priests convinced the people that Jesus must die. When <b>Pontius Pilate</b> asked what he should do with Jesus, they shouted, "Crucify him!"</p>

## Sacrifice

At **the Last Supper**, Jesus declared the words that are now written in the Bible (John 15:13):

‘Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one’s life for one’s friends’.

Christians believe that Jesus **sacrificed** himself for others.




## Prayer

Christians believe **prayers** are a way of communicating with God. It is a way of offering thanks and asking for forgiveness.



## Crucifixion

A crown of thorns was put on Jesus’ head. He had to carry his own large wooden **cross** up a hill. At the top of the hill, Jesus was nailed to the **cross**, with nails through his hands and feet. Jesus was left on the **cross** to die.



## The Tomb

After Jesus died on the **cross**, he was taken down from the **cross** and laid in a **tomb** by his friends. They rolled a large stone in front of the entrance of the **tomb**.



## Resurrection

On the third day after Jesus’ **crucifixion**, the stone of the **tomb** had been rolled away. His body was gone from the **tomb** and an angel told **Mary Magdalene** that Jesus had risen from the dead.
